The '15th Birthday' Makeover

Thank you to everyone who helped us box up and empty the museum on February 3rd. The Children's Shoe Company donated boxes. Geoff Wood found us a temporary home for Hunt's bicycle. Stuart Moran found us space for our heaviest items nearby. Nicola Allen allowed us to display the Higginson Drum inside the Leisure Centre.

Particular thanks for the clearance go to Teresa, Sue, Bruce, Ross, Geoff, Alan, Rick and Mike. I hope I've not forgotten anyone. We also paid Callum to help us with the heavy stuff. He worked ceaselessly for 4 hours up and down stairs and into the vaults. It was amazing and scary to see the museum just an empty shell again. Here, after the lighting was changed:



New Look Planned

We planned new lighting and flooring; a smaller specially-commissioned reception desk and matching bookcase for reference books; a small office where we'll keep all the necessary clutter we need to hide from the public. We planned new equipment too to make things easier and better for both volunteers and visitors.

We also planned to install insulation and double glazing, with clear windows at the front so that people could see what we offer and black out blinds when needed. Other plans included a better retail area and a contactless donations box for visitors to donate their chosen amount easily by tapping their card, without needing help from volunteers.

No plan without glitches!

Things were not entirely straightforward. When we took down the display boarding, we found extensive rot in the timbers of the west wall. We took immediate action to remedy this, so the refurbishment wouldn't be held up too long. We informed our landlord, Bucks Council, and they inspected the work, approved, and asked for some more to be done. We were very pleased to hear they will reimburse us for that work. It has all meant several weeks' delays, so it was not possible to reopen as originally planned at Easter.

6th April 'soft' opening

After over two months' closure, Marlow Museum was delighted to reopen gently on 6th April after an extensive refurbishment.

With the support of Buckinghamshire Council and funding from the SW Chilterns Community Board, Marlow Town Council, The Shanly Foundation and SE Museums Development, the building has been transformed. We are very grateful for the additional support we received from our neighbour Court Garden Leisure Centre, and the many companies who worked to help us make the building more energy efficient and sustainable.

We have replaced the old fluorescent tubes with LED lighting, insulated the loft and walls, double glazed the windows, redecorated and put down new flooring. This has made the museum feel much warmer and more comfortable for everyone. After removing clutter and putting admin items into a side room, it also feels much more spacious. A new

reception desk, reference shelves and retail area complete the new look. Outside, we have installed vinyl overlays on the windows to make the museum more eye catching and make our opening hours clearly visible. Marlow Mayor Cllr David Brown kindly agreed to apply the vinyl overlays for us, using his professional experience. He even brought his chain of office along so that we could get some photos for our archives.





New Display

Our current temporary exhibition is a display of 'Twenty Remarkable Marlovians' through the ages. Come and see whether you've heard of them all. The photo, right, shows it only part complete.

Still to do

There are still one or two things to complete. Passers-by will have noticed the rotten wood on the outside back corner, which we've been waiting and waiting for a spell of dry weather to replace. Once all's done, we can continue with our work towards becoming an Accredited Museum, which we hope to achieve next year.

He's still as enthusiastic as ever and still working to ensure the Museum remains a key feature of Marlow into the future. He has taken the makeover in his stride, when everything was being taken to pieces, just focussing on when we could reopen and greet visitors again. Thank you, Mike, for all you've done to help develop Marlow Museum.

After 15 years, a change in subscriptions.

During the Management Committee meeting in March we were expecting a rather large operating deficit for the year 2023-24. Our current Fundraising Plan acknowledges that we cannot rely on getting grants to cover ordinary running costs, we can only get them for specific projects like the makeover. This means we need to raise more of our own income through subscriptions, sales, donations, and fundraising social events, to cover our £10k a year running costs.

Having kept Membership subscriptions at the same level since 2009, the Management Committee has decided that we should raise them for the year 2024-25, starting in May. We also decided to recombine Members and Friends, since a Friends' fundraising social group has never really developed as originally intended.

So from May 1st 2024, individual membership will become £20 a year, family membership will be £30 and corporate membership will be £100. A Friends organisation could develop again in the future, if there is enough support. We are sorry these increases have become necessary, but hope that you will understand and continue to support your Museum. New members are very welcome.
